The mission of Missouri River Relief is to **engage individuals and communities** along the Missouri River in the **exploration, enjoyment, restoration and care** of the river through hands-on river **clean-ups, education events & stewardship activities.**

From St. Louis to St. Joseph, River Relief volunteers got a lot done, helping us to conduct and participate in more river clean-ups than ever before.

1,442 volunteers, helped us remove 45 tons of trash, from more than 107 miles of river! It’s been a true Missouri River, community effort.

We began the year cleaning up at the Confluence of two of America’s largest rivers, and then headed upriver in the Spring to host our big community clean-ups in the river towns of St. Joe and Leavenworth.

Our first clean-up in Leavenworth and Weston, these two river communities welcomed us with hospitality and openness to our organization. Both communities were easy to work with and made planning this first-time event fun and seamless. During our trash scouts, we were amazed at the amount of trash we DIDN’T see. Amazing.

In the Fall, we saw the return of the Big Muddy Clean Sweep, a two-month continuous clean-up voyage from Brunswick to Hermann, only without a barge. The river threw us constant curveballs, with several events being revamped at the last minute by flood conditions. But as always, the Missouri River Relief staff and volunteer crew rolled with the punches and made each event a special one.
