The Greenway Network - Our St. Charles neighbors along the Missouri River work to conserve natural resources, encourage sound management of watersheds and more. They will provide an up-cycling activity for children.

Washington Historical Society - Explore our rich Missouri River history with local experts who bring Washington's history alive with photos and stories!

Washington Community Garden - There is a beautiful community garden at Peace Lutheran Church which is visible from Hwy 47 and 14th streets. Find out more about it and participate in various nature crafts.

Washington Urban Forestry Council - plants green space throughout our community. Come on by for a fun way to learn about trees and leaves.

Hillermann Nursery - Native plants! Not just weeds in the field, they're our heritage. Talk with Patty, the native plant buyer from Hillermann Nursery. Bring the kids by for a seed planting activity.

Missouri Master Naturalists - will provide a fun, hands-on activity and bring along an EnviroScape non-point source pollution model! Find out what that is at their booth. Their mission is to engage Missourians in the stewardship of our natural resources through education and community service.

Native American Tipi - Old-time music from local musicians, and old-fashioned candle making activities from our friends Marty and Maureen Hoelscher.

The Nature Conservancy - Check out this interactive demonstration to see how nature filters water, and learn how trees and plants help keep our rivers and streams healthy. Enter for a chance to win a Nature Conservancy stuffed animal!

Magnificent Missouri - supports and brings awareness to the unique resources and beautiful landscape of Missouri. Magnificent Missouri CDs, which feature songs about Missouri, will be given away hourly.
