RIVER CAMP 2009 Comments from the "Vision Tree" September 17, 2009 California Island, Missouri River mile 177

On a beautiful night in September, Missouri River Relief hosted a group of our sponsors, partners and friends for a candlelight banquet on sandy California Island on the Missouri River. At each place setting, visitors were invited to write or draw their vision for the Missouri River. They later hung these from a driftwood sculpture we called the Vision Tree. "A naturally functioning, selfsustaining, diverse river with engaged people and healthy communities"


"A beautiful natural world; clean, loved & a lovingly utilized river"


"Growing up near the confluence of the mighty Mississippi & the
